This contract may be replaced in accordance with DoD/AF requirements for new contract year.

1. PHOTO RELEASE: I authorize and consent to the photographing or video taping of my child and understand that any videos, photographs or child artwork may be used for marketing and publicity purposes of the program. This authorization will remain in effect until rescinded by me in writing to the appropriate center or by my duly appointed representative.

2. SUNSCREEN, INSECT REPELLENT, LIP BALM AND BODY LOTION: The CDC will provide and apply SUNSCREEN, INSECT REPELLENT, PETROLEUM JELLY AND BODY LOTION that is approved by the program medical advisor for children 6 months and older. Children younger than 6 months must have a Primary Care Manager authorization for each of these product applications. See parent handbook for SAP information concerning these items.

3. INTERNET: Computers with Internet access are available and used within the programs for children 3 years and older. Children in the CDC have access with direct supervision of a caregiver. Children in the SAP have access with periodic supervision by a staff member. An internet security measure, such as Cyber-Sitter or Net Nanny, is available to block inappropriate sites.

4. RELEASE OF INFORMATION FOR ALLERGIES OR SPECIAL NEEDS: To ensure children are protected, a list of children identified by the program with an allergy or special need is supplied monthly to each classroom, kitchen, front desk, and supervisory staff. This list is posted where necessary and covered with a Privacy Act Cover page to ensure confidentiality of its contents.
